



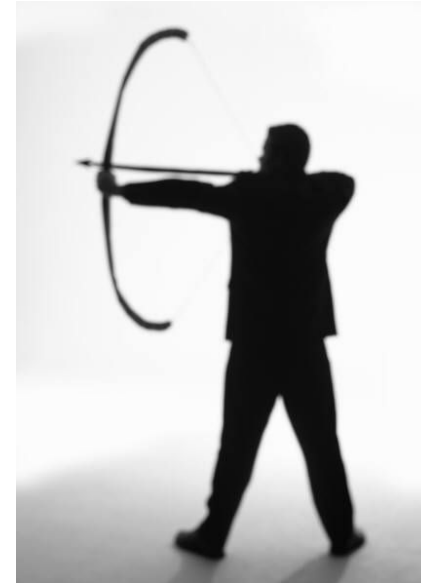

According to The U.S. Department of Labor's Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) from the years 2003- 2009 there has been 515 fatal injuries in Waste Management and Remediation Services, in which 57 were at Solid Waste Landfills.

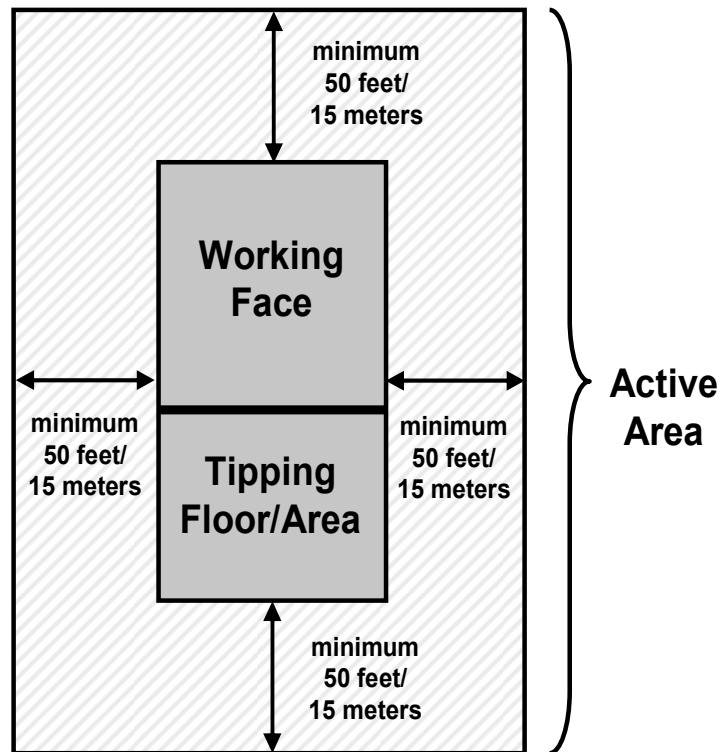
